KASICH SIGNS FOUR BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

Sub. H.B. 18 (Baker) authorizes grants to an employer that moves operations into a previously vacant facility and increases payroll by hiring and employing employees at the facility;

Sub. H.B. 152 (Mallory) exempts amateur boxing, kick boxing, karate, or wrestling events that benefit a charitable organization conducted under the supervision of the Fraternal Order of Police of Ohio, the Ohio Association of Professional Firefighters, or the Northern Ohio Fire Fighters from regulations by the Ohio Athletics Commission;

Am. S.B. 260 (Obhof) designates May as Pediatric Stroke Awareness Month; and

Sub. S.B. 268 (Eklund) provides for the taking of a DNA sample from a person who is charged with a felony but not arrested for the offense or whose DNA sample related to a felony offense was not taken when required. It also provides for a court order, upon the person's request, requiring the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation to seal DNA specimens, records, and profiles taken from a person when found not guilty, the charges are dismissed with prejudice, or the charges are dismissed without prejudice and the statute of limitations has expired.
