KASICH SIGNS SEVEN BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

H.B. 341 (Smith) establishes requirements to be followed by prescribers in reviewing patient information in the State Board of Pharmacy's Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System;

H.B. 483 (Amstutz) makes operating and other appropriations and provides authorization and conditions for the operation of state programs;

H. B. 486 (Baker & Stebleton) revises the coordination of workforce development and economic development programs, revises the law regarding innovation financial assistance and research and development financial assistance, and requires the Department of Job and Family Services to consult with the Governor's executive workforce board and create a list of in-demand jobs in this state;

H. B. 487 (Brenner) impacts education provisions for students in grades kindergarten through twelve;

H.B. 488 (Dovilla & Landis) requires state institutions of higher education to award credit for military training, and to make other changes regarding state support and benefits for veterans and their spouses;

H.B. 492 (Scherer) provides authorization and conditions for levy and administration of taxes in the state and makes an appropriation;

H.B. 493 (Sears & Hennem) makes changes to Ohio's Workers' Compensation Law.
