KASICH SIGNS EIGHTEEN BILLS INTO LAW

COLUMBUS—Today Gov. John R. Kasich signed the following pieces of legislation into law:

Sub. H.B. 117 (Hackett) provides for the operation of captive insurance companies in Ohio and special purpose captive insurance companies;

H.B. 286 (Sears & Letson) authorizes the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council to meet via interactive video conference or teleconference;

Sub. S.B. 278 (Jones) requires the completion of a sudden unexplained infant death investigation reporting form (SUIDI reporting form) developed by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or an alternative reporting form developed by the Director of Health, whenever a child one year of age or younger dies suddenly when in apparent good health and to require that the appropriate child fatality review board receive a copy of each completed form;

Am. Sub. H.B. 292 (Perales) creates the Ohio Aerospace and Aviation Technology Committee;

Am. Sub. H.B. 213 (Pelanda & Celebrezze) grants a motion for permanent custody of a child to a movant if the child or another child in the custody of a parent has been adjudicated an abused, neglected, or dependent child on three separate occasions;

Sub. H.B. 309 (Pelanda) amends requirements regarding protection order fees, including court costs;

Sub. H.B. 314 (Baker & Kunze) impacts informed consent requirements for opioid prescriptions issued to minors, disclosure of medical and other information to child fatality review boards and fetal and infant mortality review teams, and the location of methadone treatment facilities;

Sub. H.B. 393 (Baker) requires public high schools to publish annually a career decision guide in its newsletter or on its web site;

Sub. H.B. 366 (Sprague) requires hospice care programs to establish procedures to prevent diversion of controlled substances that contain opioids;

Am. Sub. S.B. 263 (Peterson & Beagle) requires the Tax Commissioner to notify taxpayers of tax or fee overpayments, to authorize the Commissioner to either apply an overpayment to future tax liabilities or issue a refund, and to make an appropriation;

S.B. 300 (Beagle) designates September as “Mitochondrial Disease Awareness Month;”

Am. S.B. 230 (Oelslager & Manning) establishes standards for the delivery of non-self-injectable cancer drugs;

Am. S.B. 99 (Oelslager & Tavares) impacts insurance coverage for orally administered cancer;

Am. Sub. S.B. 43 (Burke & Tavares) impacts the laws governing the civil commitment of and treatment provided to mentally ill persons;

Sub. H.B. 129 (Stautberg) specifies that aggravated menacing, menacing by stalking, and menacing include words or conduct that are directed at or identify a corporation, association, or other organization that employs the victim or to which the victim belongs and to authorize the corporation, association, or other organization that employs two or more victims or to which two or more victims belong to seek protection orders in certain cases;

Am. Sub. S.B. 3 (LaRose) reforms rule-making and rule-review procedures and regulatory processes;

Sub. S.B. 78 (Hughes) impacts the law regulating specialty construction contractors;

Am. S.B. 294 (Hughes) designates September as “Safe Driving Awareness Month.”

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
