Infrastructure projects help create jobs and connect businesses to the communities they serve. Lieutenant Governor Mary Taylor spoke at the decommissioning ceremony for State Route 59 in Akron. This \$16.5 million project is expected to provide a safer roadway system through the area with new LED street lighting, a complete reconstruction of the storm drainage system, and updated traffic signals. The roadway, built in the 1960's to handle 120,000 cars a day, is being reduced to reconnect an isolated neighborhood to downtown Akron and to create 31 acres of urban parks and developable land. Our state and localities are using infrastructure projects as economic development tools to attract and retain diverse businesses to create jobs and increase quality of life for our citizens.



On the 16th anniversary of the September 11th attacks, Lt. Governor Taylor helped dedicate the City of Green First Responders Monument to honor all those who serve our communities.
