Don't Get Me Started is a statewide public service campaign kicked off in January 2012 in partnership with the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) and the Ohio Association of County Behavioral Health Authorities (OACBHA). The campaign is designed to educate young adults (ages 18-29) about prescription opiate abuse and addiction, reaching them with a message that motivates them to steer clear of prescription drug misuse and abuse, while providing information on treatment resources in their area for themselves or a loved one.



The Ohio State Highway Patrol is cracking down on drug trafficking in Ohio with the introduction of legislation targeting hidden compartments in vehicles and changes in how drivers can use the State Highway Patrol hotline. #677 is a new, simpler way to report impaired driving and suspected drug activity. Signs have been placed by entrances to the state along major routes warning travelers that "Drug Traffickers Go to Prison."


