RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon the Governor and Lieutenant Governor to recognize important moments in Ohio history; and

WHEREAS, the Northwest Territory, established by the Ordinance of 1787, included what is now Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, and parts of Minnesota, and set forth provisions for how a territory could become a state; and

WHEREAS, President Thomas Jefferson signed the Enabling Act into law in April 1802, allowing Ohio to apply for statehood. Territorial leaders convened in Chillicothe in November of that year to draft the state's first Constitution, a document that was delivered by Thomas Worthington to Congress, where it was approved and signed by the president on February 19, 1803; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 1803, the first General Assembly met in Chillicothe to complete the transfer of power. Chillicothe served as Ohio's capital from 1803 to 1810, and again from 1812 to 1816; and

WHEREAS, in 1953, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a congressional joint resolution officially recognizing March 1, 1803 as the official date of Ohio's statehood; and


WHEREAS, on this special day, we recognize the many individuals who have given their time and energy to strengthen and enrich the Buckeye State over the course of its 214 year history.
